#### **Executive Summary**

The year 2022 was filled with challenges, recovery, and opportunities. CMP worked with over 4,000 youth, entrepreneurs, job seekers, English language learners, and community members to help them advance to the next step. Volunteers led our participants in numerous career forums and webinars to inform in topics such as digital literacy, commercial leases, or resume critique. CMP also began a new chapter in our long-term temporary space located at 55 Chrystie Street.



# **Asset Building**

Asset Building serves youth and English language learners providing the foundation they need to flourish. The program worked with 1,094 individuals.



Staff assisted individuals with learning English, obtaining new skills, finding work placements, and having a better understanding of workplace culture and the importance of having soft skills. Towards the end of the year, when trips were able to be safely executed, students and staff were able to once again enjoy the cultural aspects of New York City.

## **Career & Community Development**

While the city and the world continued to recover from the pandemic, the Career & Community Development assisted individuals with work readiness, job placement, and income security programming.



Career & Community Development programs focused on helping individuals emerge from the pandemic stronger and more resilient than they were prior to the pandemic. Working with 1,527 individuals, the program provided Digital Literacy training, skill building workshops with corporate volunteers, virtual job fairs, numerous webinars, and connecting individuals to resources.

#### Entrepreneurship

Entrepreneurs faced challenges from navigating re-opening guidelines, grant/loan/assistance programs, helping staff while trying to sustain their business and keep it afloat.



In 2022, CMP assisted 802 entrepreneurs providing training, technical assistance, oneon-one counseling, and webinars to help navigate the myriad of resources available.

# Community

In 2022, CMP has a few programs directly geared towards the general community of New York City.



The Chinese School worked with 600 students to expose them to Chinese culture and acquire Chinese language in afterschool, Saturday, and summer programs.



CMP works with international students through the Collegiate Student Service Center (CSSC). In 2022, we were able to offer peer talk forum, and the Tree Hole Program which was an information sharing and peer support program.
